

authorized village officer or employee while in the performance of his duties in making such inspections, pursuant to the provisions of section 22-3.

Such revocation, if ordered, shall not preclude prosecution and imposition of any other penalties provided for the violation of other applicable ordinances of the village.

(d) Notice of the hearing for revocation of a license or permit shall be given in writing setting forth specifically the grounds of the complaint and the time and place of the hearing. Such notice shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the business certificate holder or permittee at his last known address at least five days prior to the date set for the hearing.

(e) At the hearing the village attorney shall present the complaint and shall represent the village. The business certificate holder or permittee shall be permitted counsel and shall have the

right to submit evidence and cross examine witnesses. The village president shall preside and shall render the decision.

**Sec. 22-41. Appeals.**

Any person aggrieved by the decision of the village president in regard to the denial of an application for a business certificate, as provided in section 22-34, or in connection with the revocation of a business certificate or permit as provided in section 22-40, shall have the right to appeal to the board of trustees. Such appeal shall be taken by filing with the village clerk, within ten days after notice of a denial of an application or a revocation of a business certificate or permit, a written statement under oath setting forth specifically the grounds for appeal. The board of trustees shall thereupon set the time and place for a hearing on such appeal, and notice of such hearing shall be given to the applicant or business certificate holder or permittee in the same manner as provided in section 22-40. The decision of the board of trustees on such appeal shall be final.

**Sec. 22-42. Schedule of fees.**

Unless otherwise specifically provided elsewhere in this Code, the following fees are applicable to the respective business, occupation or activity listed in this section. All fees shown are based on a minimum square foot area of less than 1,500 square feet. For the full fee of businesses located in premises with over 1,500 square feet, see subsection (3) of this section. An additional fee of \$25.00 shall be charged any new licensee per year for occupancy and zoning check. Further, in addition to the enumerated fees herein, there shall be an additional fee of \$25.00 for any business conducted from a kiosk or mobile or temporary facility.
